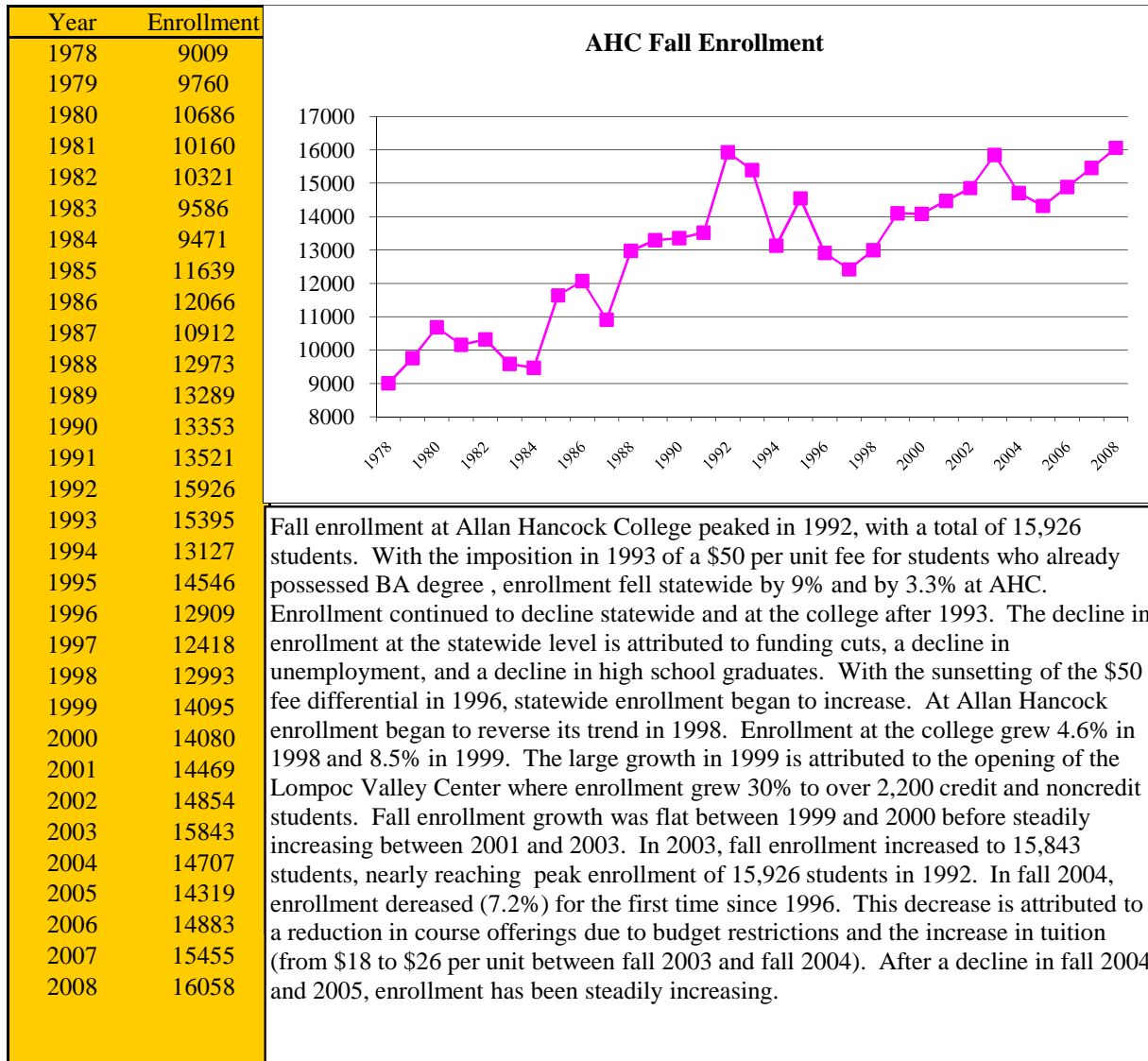

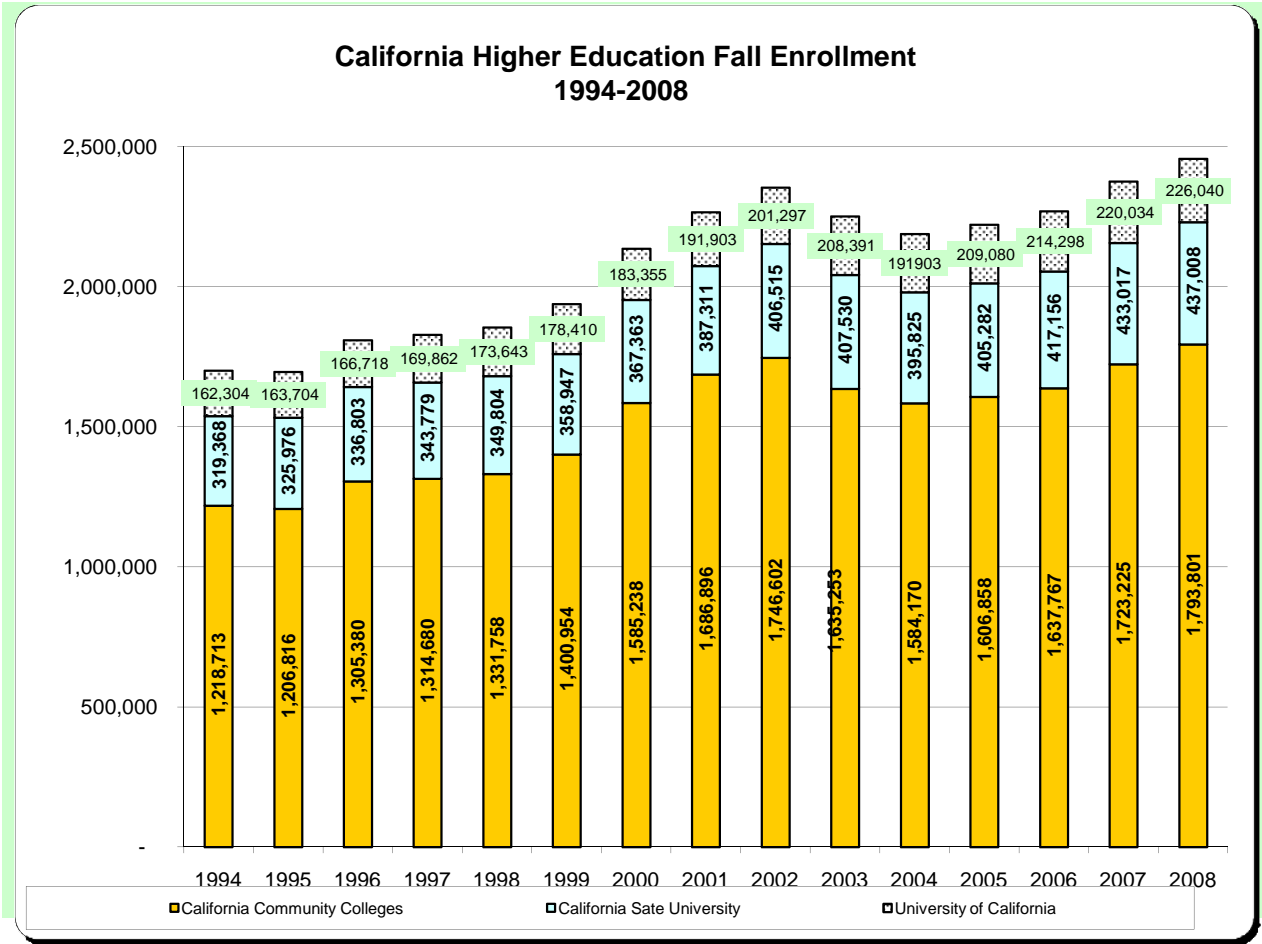


California Enrollment in Higher Education

According to a CPEC report (*An Update of the Commission's Community College Enrollment Demand Projections by Region*, March 2005), enrollment in California community colleges is expected to increase because of continued improvement in the economy that would boost growth in jobs for which the community colleges are a major provider of workforce training and preparation, the need for remedial education, and the strategic planning initiatives in place that improve transfer readiness, certification and licensure completion relates, basic skills acquisition, and welfare to work transition. Between 2003 and 2013, an increase of 714,753 (35.8%) students in higher education is projected, with 563,690 (32.2%) more in community colleges (an annual change of 2.57% per year).

As the charts on the next pages indicate, fall enrollment in the public four-year system had been increasing since 1994 until 2003 when the state budget reductions impacted the system. Statewide community college enrollment increased between 1995 and 2002. In fall 2003 community college enrollment declined due to budget reductions and the fee increase from \$11 to \$18 per unit. Although the fees increased from \$18 to \$26 per unit in fall 2004, enrollment statewide increased slightly. Allan Hancock enrollment hit an eleven year low in 1996 and has grown or remained flat each year until fall 2004. AHC managed strong growth of 6.6% in fall 2003 despite the statewide CC decline of -6.7%. The trend reversed in fall 2004 and fall 2005 when AHC enrollment declined at a faster rate than statewide CC enrollment. AHC and statewide CC enrollment increased in fall 2006, 3.9% and 2.3%, respectively, with the same gains for AHC and statewide CC enrollment in fall 2007 and fall 2008.

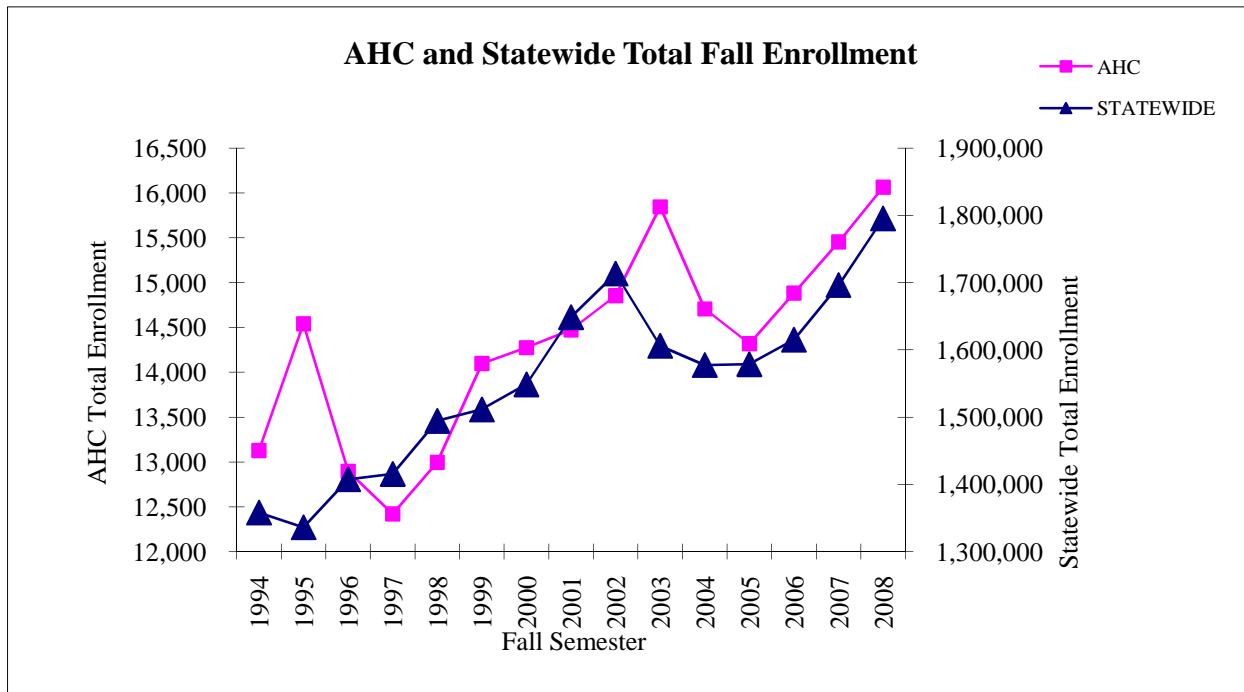

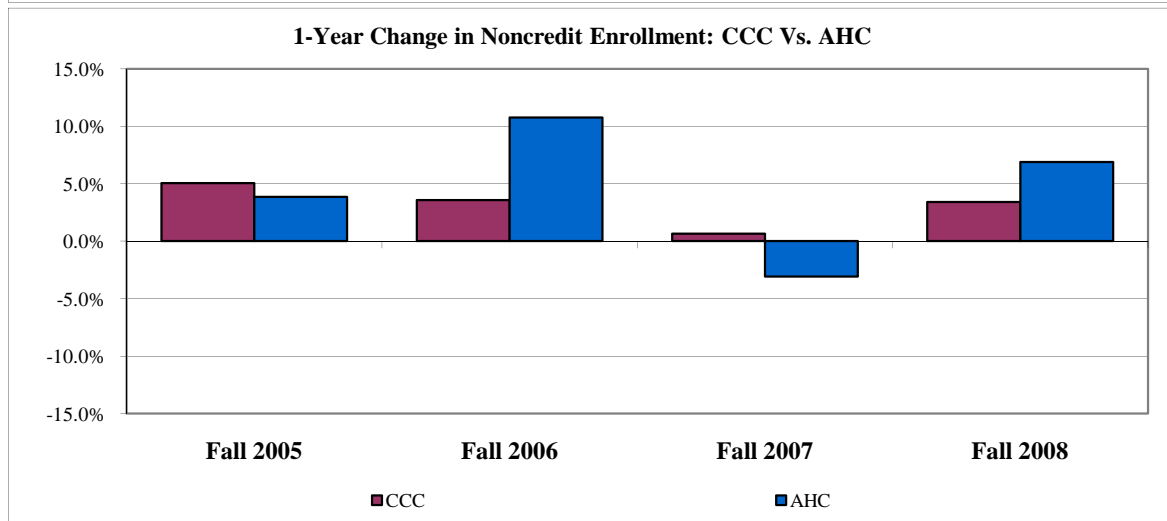
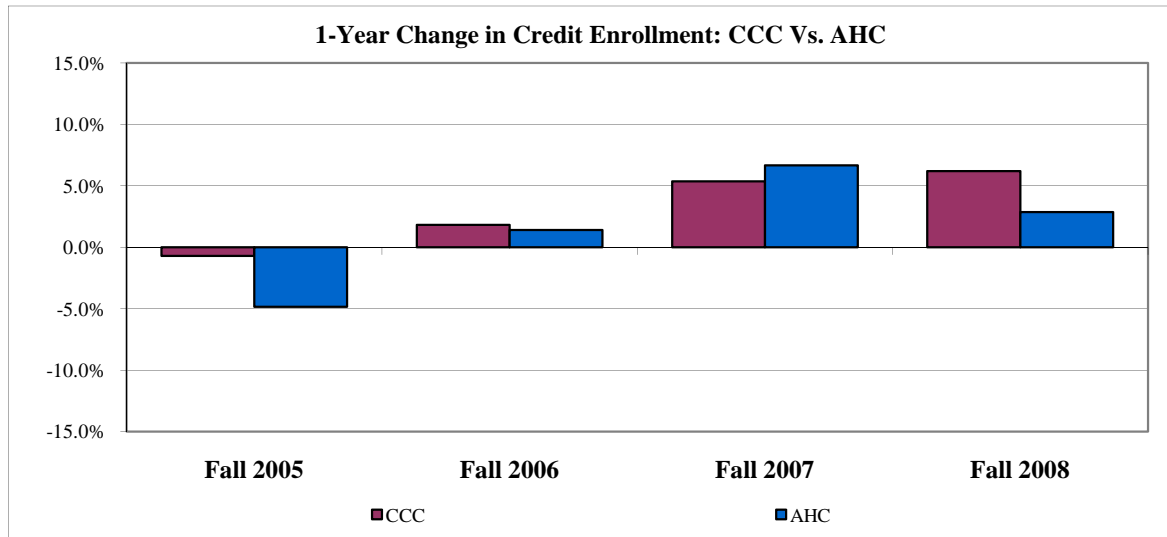

Definitions

The following sections report enrollment information based on minimum attendance requirements.

FTR, *Full Term Reporting*, is a term used to indicate whether the student has met the minimum attendance requirements as either a credit or noncredit student as of term-end.

The Chancellors office defines FTR credit and noncredit students as follows:

Credit FTR:

Student enrolled in at least one of the following:

- Weekly/daily census section
- Credit positive attendance section with 8 or more hours or .5 or more units earned.
- Credit independent study section with .5 or more units earned.

Noncredit FTR:

Student enrolled in noncredit positive attendance section(s) with 8 or more hours, and did not enroll in a credit course. If a student meets one of the criteria to be a credit student, they are counted as such, and they are not counted as noncredit even if they enrolled in a noncredit course. This allows credit and noncredit enrollment at the district level to be added without double counting.

District Information

The *AHC District* section reports student enrollment based on their FTR status and course status.

Credit enrollment includes students enrolled in credit courses who meet the credit FTR criteria.

NonCredit enrollment includes students enrolled in noncredit courses who meet the noncredit FTR criteria.

Total noncredit enrollment (regardless of FTR status) is also reported.

Center Information

The center specific sections report credit enrollment using the same definitions as the district information. However, noncredit enrollment at the center is reported using a different definition.

Credit enrollment includes students enrolled in credit courses taken by credit FTR students.

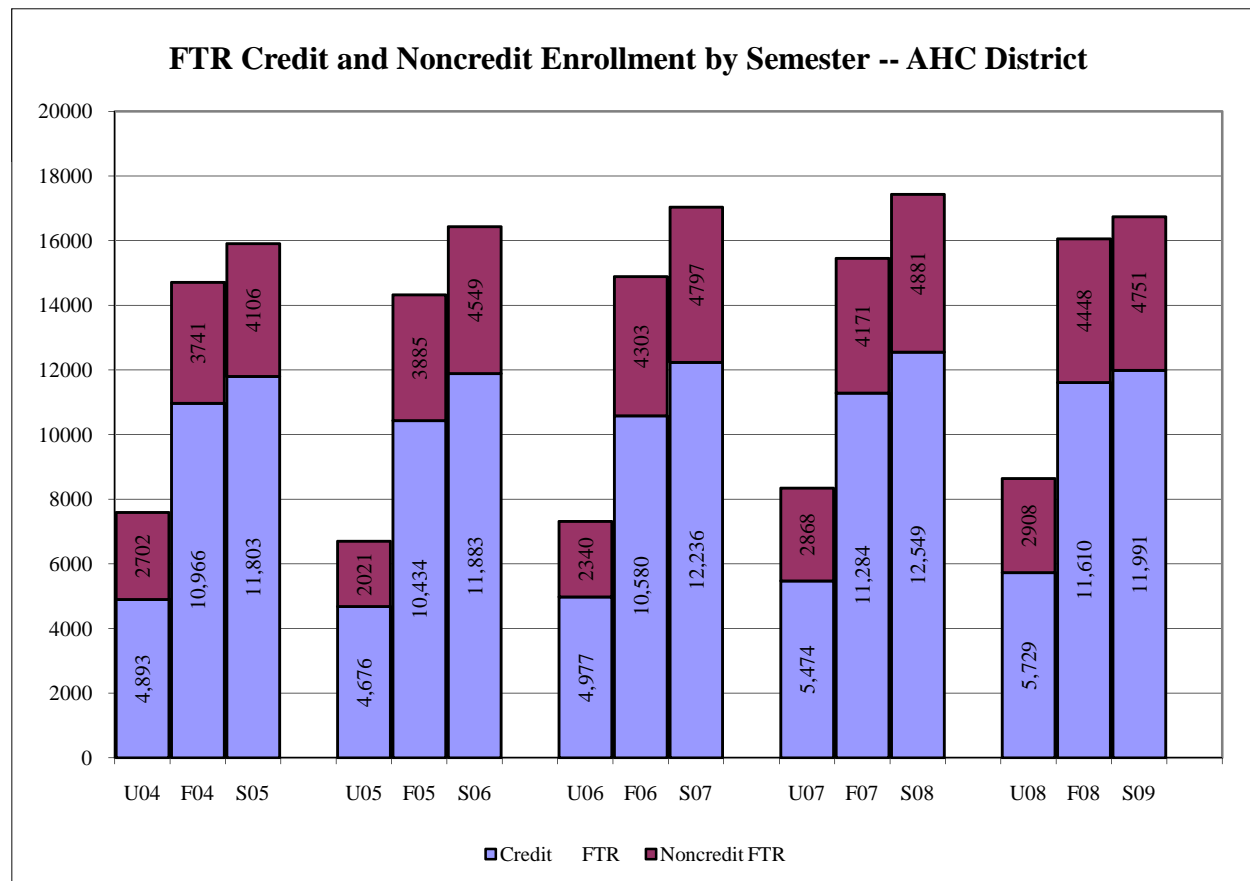
Noncredit enrollment includes students enrolled in noncredit courses taken by *credit or noncredit FTR* students.

Since a student may take both a credit and noncredit course, the center enrollment totals include the unduplicated count of students enrolled at that center.

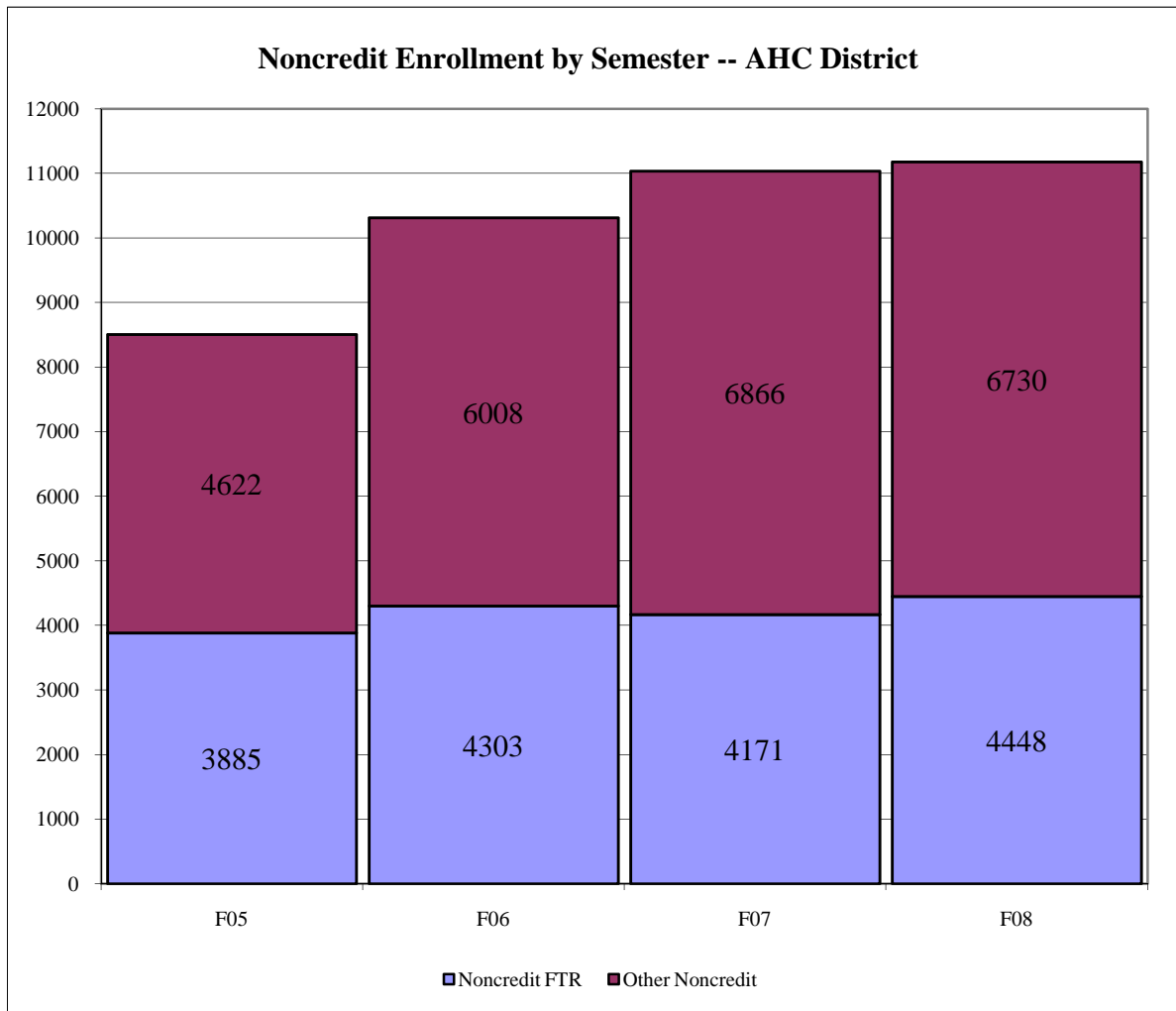
In 2008, credit enrollment increased for summer and fall semesters by 4.7% and 2.9%, respectively. In spring 2009, credit enrollment decreased 4.4% from the previous spring. Non-credit enrollment behaved similarly with slight increases in summer and fall and a decrease in spring compared to the previous year. Total annual enrollment for the 2008-09 academic year fell 3.8% to 25,784 students (unduplicated annual

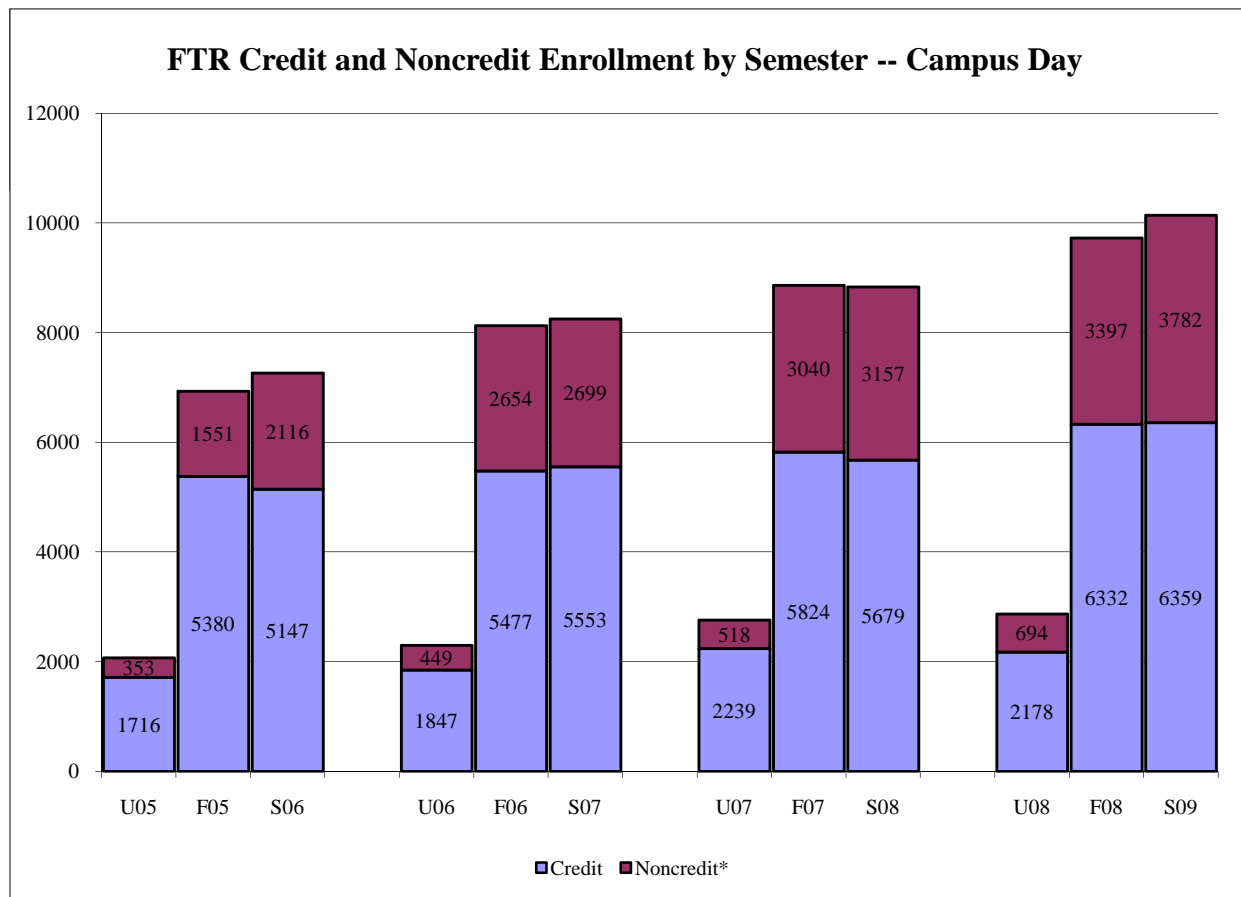

The total number of students enrolled at campus day in fall 2008 increased by 8.7% for credit enrollment and 11.7% for noncredit enrollment. In spring 2009 total enrollment increased 11.8%, with an increase in credit enrollment of 12.0%, and an increase in noncredit enrollment of 19.8%.

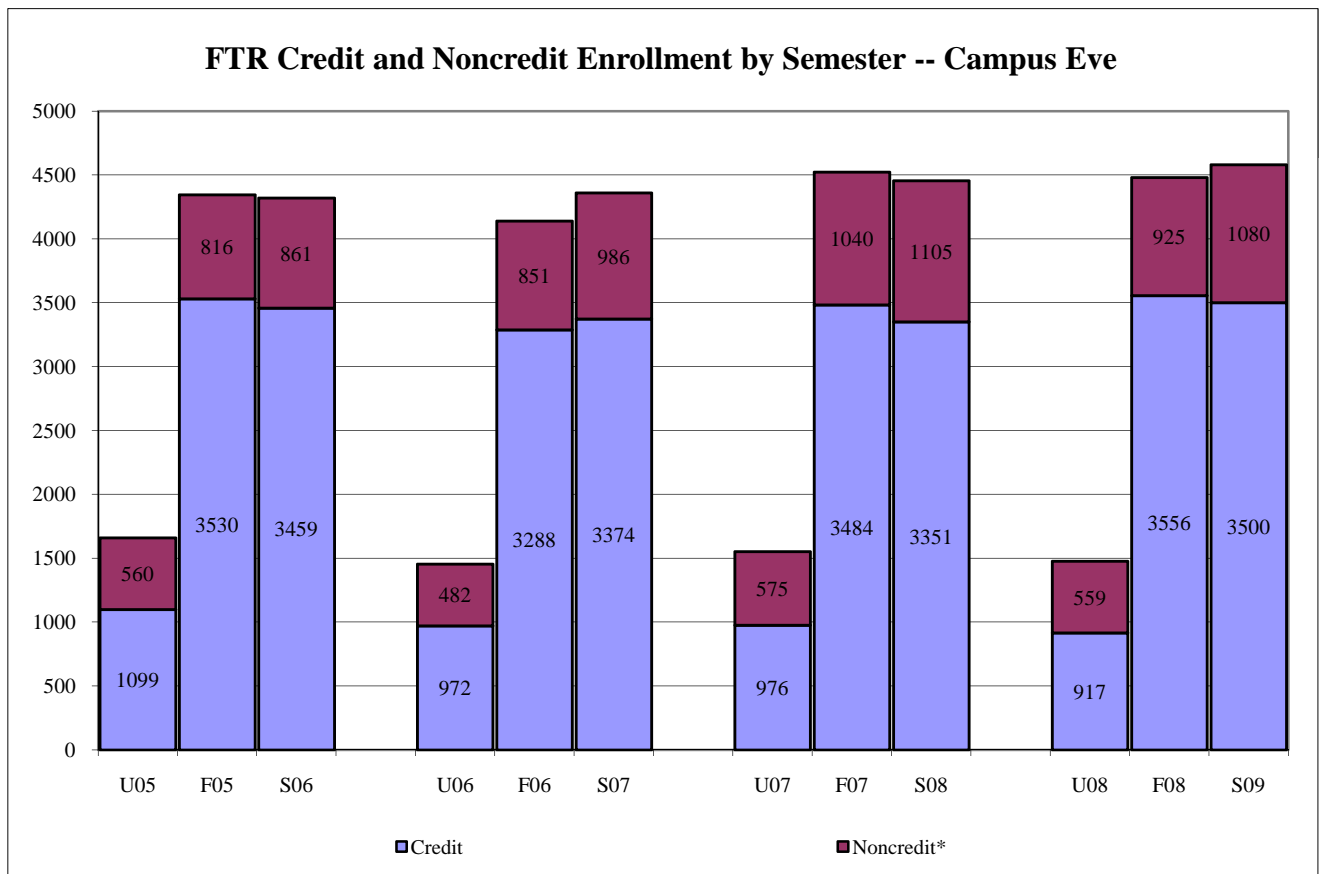

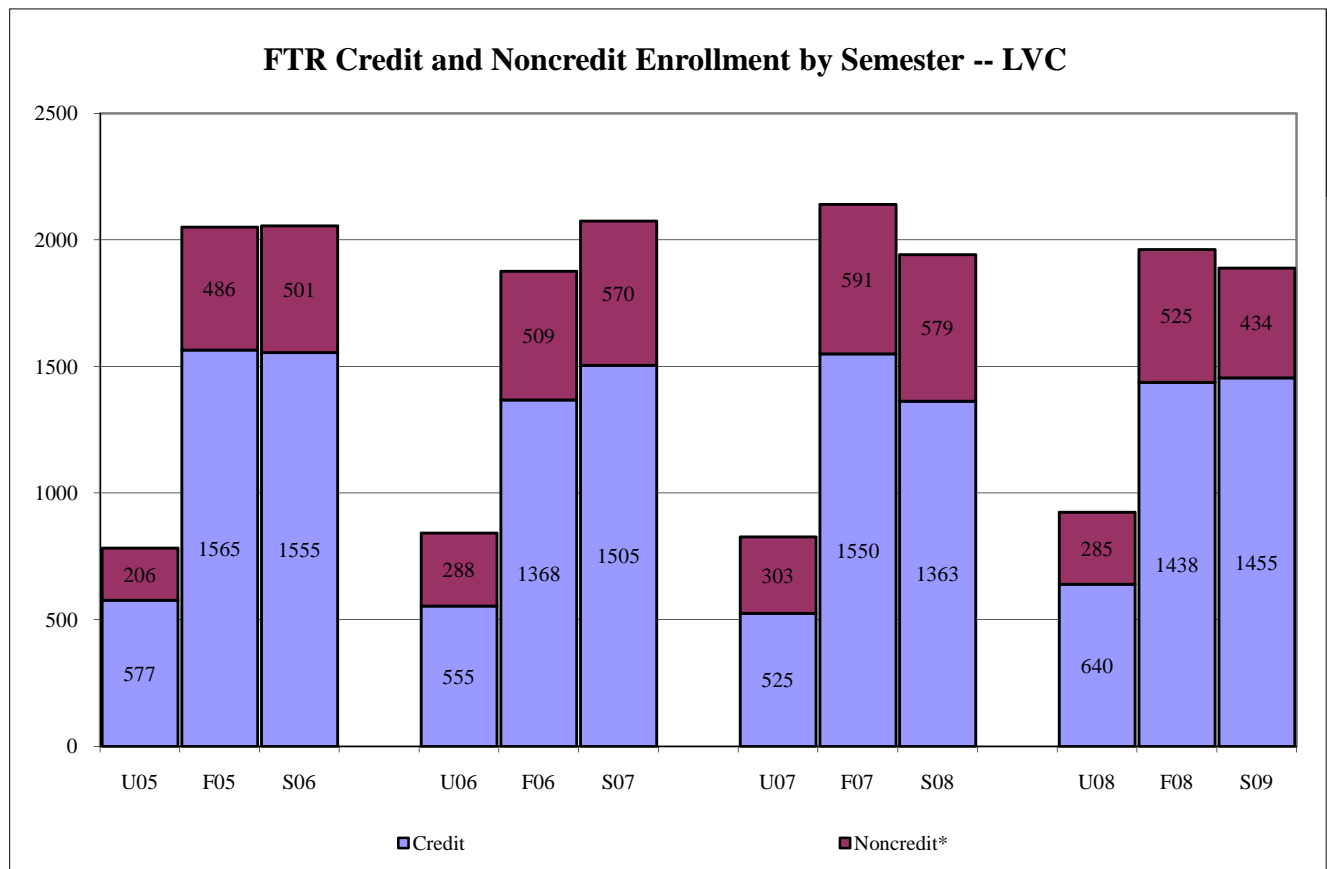
The total number of students enrolled at campus evening decreased -0.9% in fall 2008, with an increase in credit enrollment of 2.1%, and a decrease in noncredit enrollment of -11.1%. In spring 2009 total enrollment increased slightly (3.3%), with an increase in credit enrollment of 4.4%, and a decrease in noncredit enrollment of -2.3%.

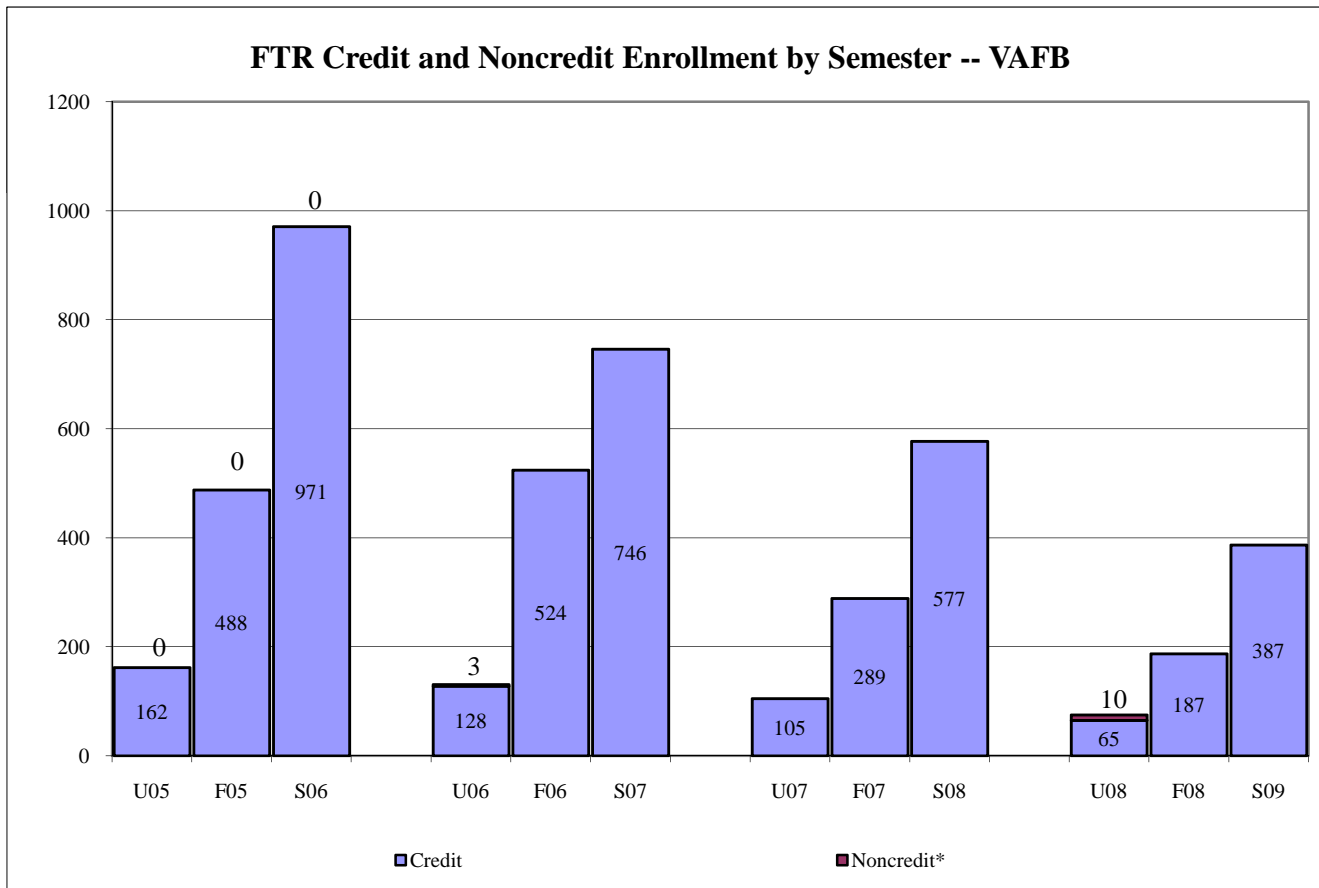
The total number of students enrolled at the LVC decreased -8.1% in fall 2008, with a decrease in credit enrollment of -7.2%, and a decrease in noncredit enrollment of -11.2%. In spring 2009 total enrollment decreased -2.2%, with an increase in credit enrollment of 6.7%, and a rather large decrease in noncredit enrollment of -25.0%.

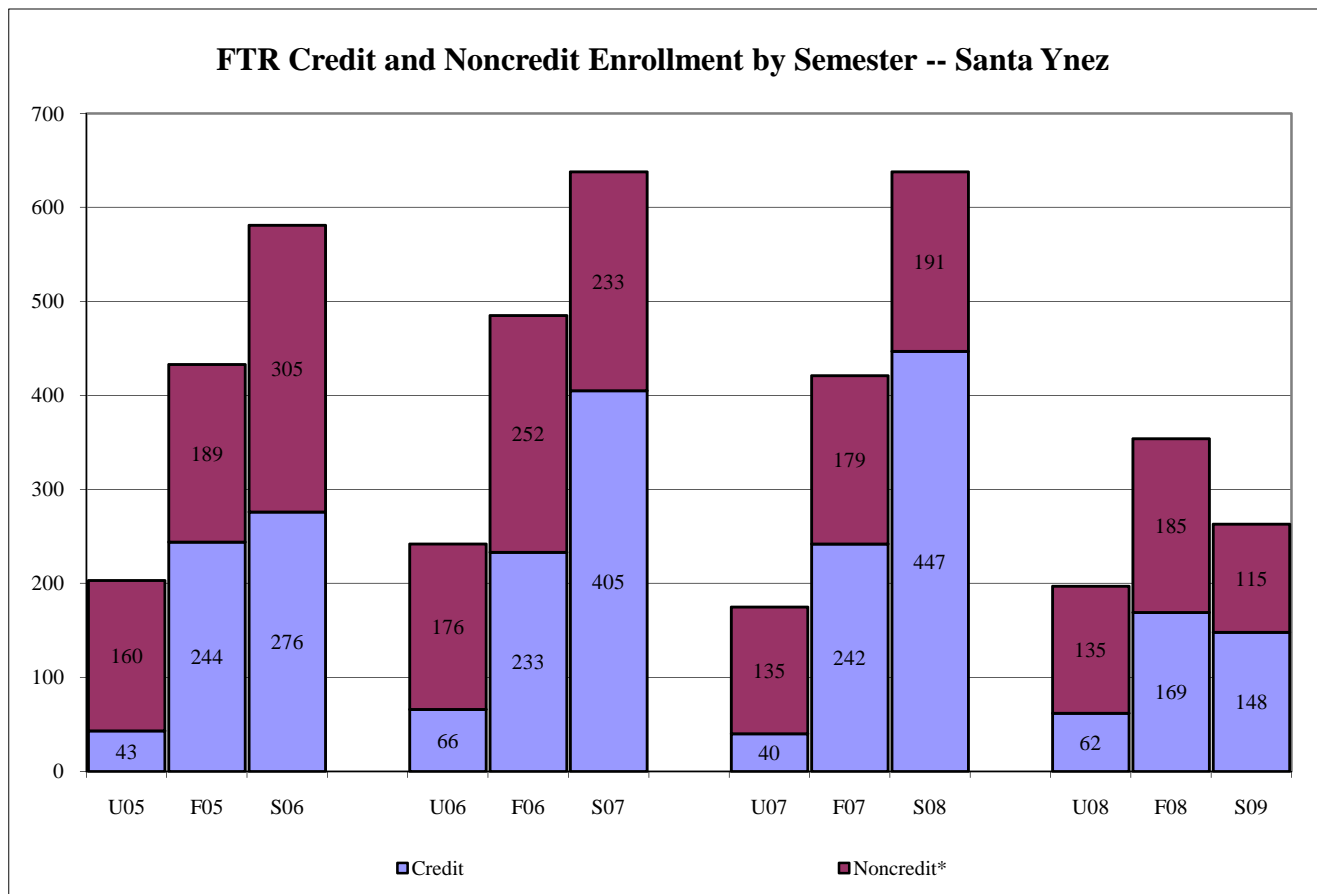
The number of students enrolling at VAFB has been steadily declining since the 2001-2002 academic year; however, credit enrollment rose 7.4% from fall 2005 to fall 2006, but decreased by -60.1% between spring 2006 and spring 2009. There were 10 noncredit students at VAFB in the 2008-2009 academic year.

The total number of students enrolled at Santa Ynez decreased in fall 2008 (-16.1%) with credit enrollment decreasing -30.2% and noncredit enrollment increasing 3.4%. In spring 2009 total enrollment decreased -58.8%, with a decrease in credit enrollment of -66.9%, and a decrease in noncredit enrollment of -39.8%.

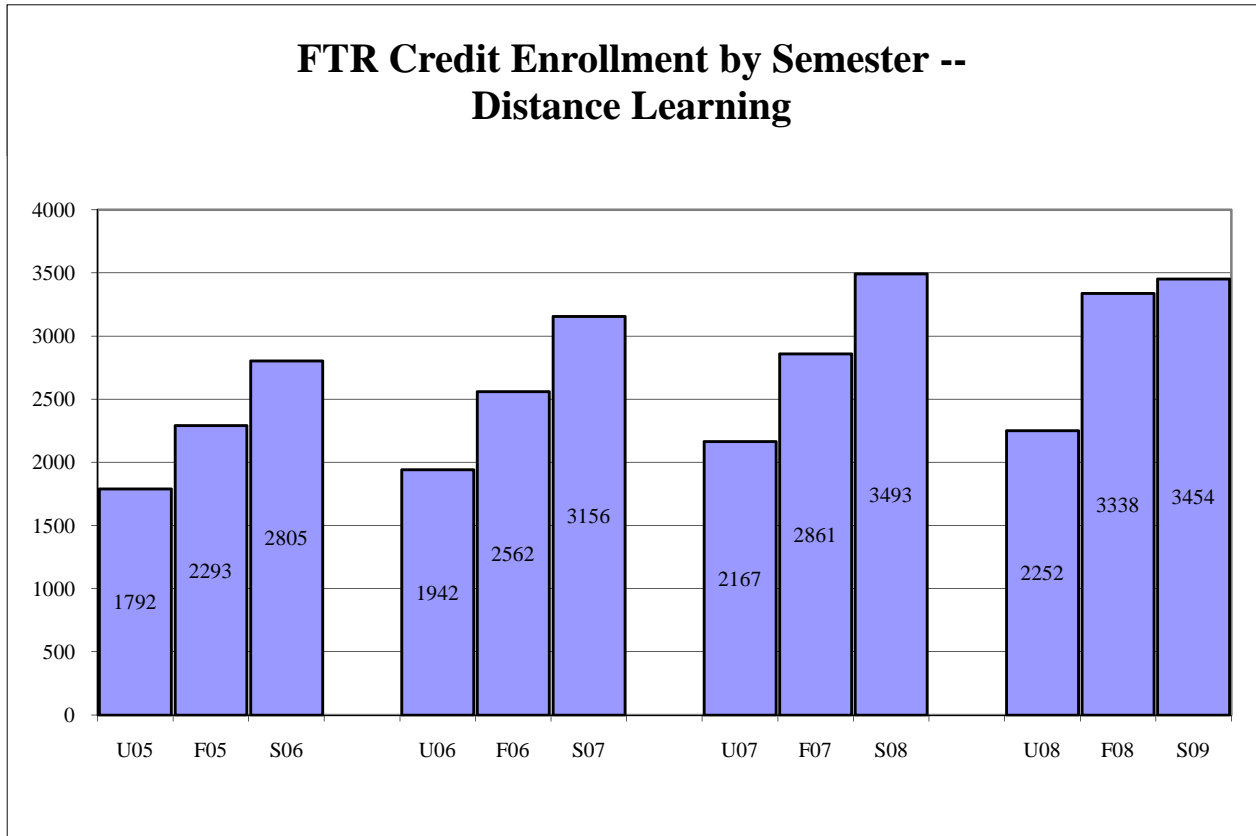

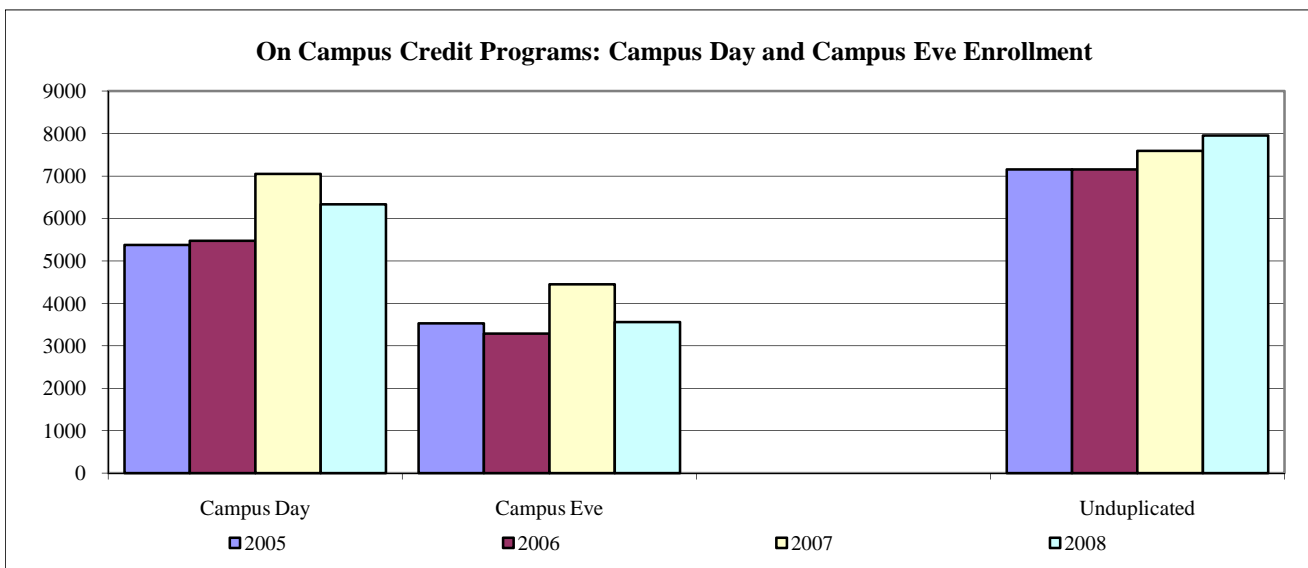
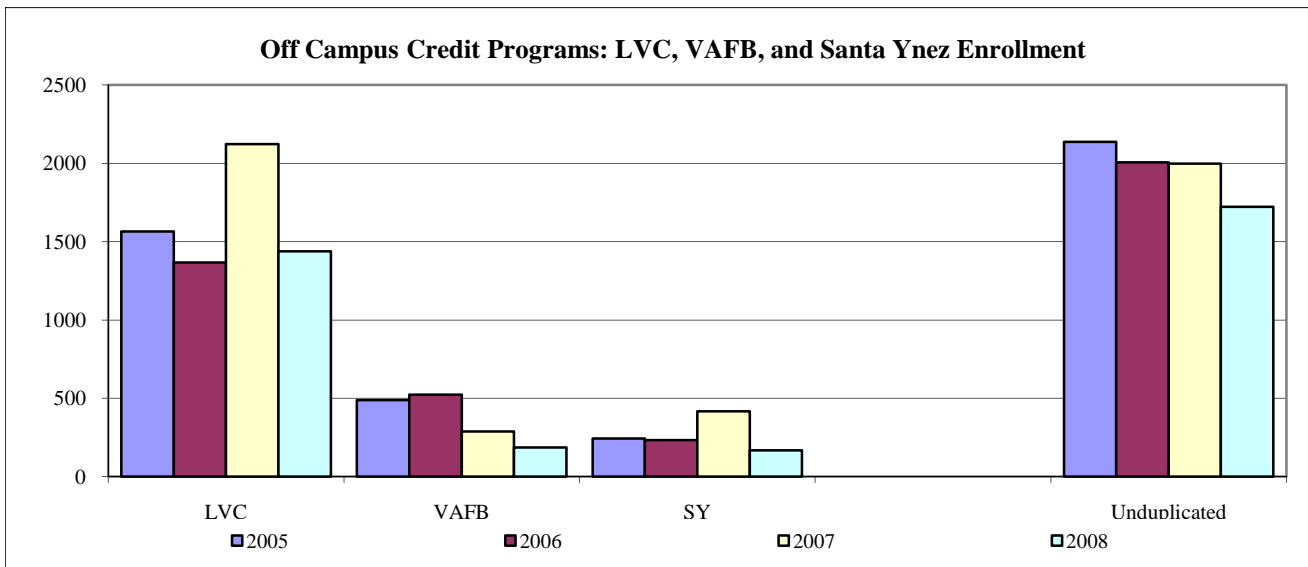

The fastest growing "center" at AHC is distance learning. There were 500 students enrolled in fall 1999 and 3454 students enrolled by spring 2009. The number of students enrolled in distance learning increased by 16.7% from fall 2007 to fall 2008; however, enrollment decreased very slightly -1.1% from spring 2008 to spring 2009.

Unduplicated enrollment in off campus centers (LVC, VAFB, and SY) dropped -14% from fall 2007 to fall 2008. Enrollment grew to 2,658 in fall 2002, but declined -35% by fall 2008 to 1,723 students. Main campus enrollment increased slightly (5%) to 7,957 from fall 2007 to fall 2008.

Many students enroll at more than one location. For example, among the 6,332 students enrolled at campus day in fall 2008, 33.7% enrolled only at campus day; 1931(30.5%) enrolled at campus evening, 309 (4.9%) enrolled at the LVC, 8 (0.1%) enrolled at Santa Ynez, 31 (0.5%) enrolled at VAFB, 1209 (19.1%) enrolled in distance learning, and 22 (0.3%) enrolled at some other off campus location.

Students enrolled at Santa Ynez and students enrolled in off-campus programs (i.e., cosmetology), are most likely to enroll only at one location. The percent of students enrolled in distance learning exclusively increased slightly from 43.1% in fall 2007 to 44.5% in fall 2008. Over half, 56%, of the students enrolled in distance learning also enrolled at another location. The percentage of LVC students taking a distance learning course increased from 13.8% to 25.2% from fall 2007 to fall 2008. The percentage of VAFB students taking a distance learning course slightly increased from 22.1% to 26.2%.
